Reverend Betty J Alexander 72, of Cheyney Pennsylvania was the oldest daughter, born on October 29, 1949 to the late Julius C. Sailor and Fannie K. Sailor in Quincy Florida. As a young child the family relocated to Chester, Pennsylvania where Betty attended grade school and was a proud graduate from Chester High School Class of 1967. She went on to earn an Associate Degree in Biology & Applied Sciences, and a Bachelor of Science from Delaware Community College. In later years, Betty furthered her studies at Lincoln University, Pennsylvania, earning a Masters of Science degree in Human Service.

As a committed, caring Registered Nurse, Betty had over 40 years of experience serving as a Nurse Administrator, Case Manager and an Instructor. Among her accomplishments, she was an 80-hour Nurse Aide program that was approved by the State of Pennsylvania Dept. of Education. She trained and mentored her Case Manager teams while at Bravo and Keystone Health Systems. In addition to her supervisory case management roles, Betty gained five years of experience as a Workers' Comp Case Manager where she contributed a wide variety of clinical experience including Med/Surg, Intensive Care Unit (ICU), Critical Care Unit (CCU) Quality Assurance, Long Term Care and Behavioral Health. At her last place of employment before retirement, Betty was responsible for writing medical policies for a Medicaid Insurance Health Plan.

Betty found joy in membership of the following female fraternal organizations: Leah Chapter #27, Chester Assembly Order of the Golden Circle and Ladies of Circle of Perfection.

Rev. Betty was a member of Thornbury A.M.E Church and has been a member since 1985. At Thornbury, Rev. Betty has held many positions including: Choir member, Choir Director, Stewardess, Steward, Sunday School Teacher and Superintendent, Director of Christian Education, Women's Group Founder, Organizer and Leader. She was Treasurer of the Anna Mary Richardson Missionary Society, co-organizer of fundraisers with trips to the Holy Land in Florida, New York and the National African American Museum in Washington D.C. Rev. Betty initiated monthly visits to Britton Manor Nursing Home and Rehabilitation Center to minister to the residents.

Reverend Betty's greatest accomplishment, besides giving her life to honor Christ, having three lovely children and marrying the love of her life, was her decision to be obedient to God and answer the call to ministry. To accomplish this, she enrolled and completed her studies at the Philadelphia/New York AME Church Institute and was ordained on Sunday December 12, 2021. Betty loved to teach, encourage others and spread the word of God. She was always willing to serve, be it in the kitchen or in the pulpit. Her life motto – To follow the greatest two commandments: "Love God with all thy heart, soul and mind" & "Love thy neighbor as thy love thyself."
