Doris was educated in the Chester Public Schools. Following her education, she was employed by Chester Hospital in the dietary department. After leaving Chester Hospital, she began working with the Greater Chester Movement to assist senior citizens in the community. Doris worked with the seniors at the center as well as making home visits. She then continued employment with the Chester Public Schools as a swim aide, lunch aide and finally, a bus aide until the arrival of her first grandchild.

as she did with her grandchildren and family members. Doris loved her family deeply -- her husband, her children, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren. She lived to make them happy. She loved spending time with them all, going on weekly shopping trips, having family dinners, going out to eat, and family vacations. Doris also loved a good casino trip.
