Years later, she joined Miller Memorial Baptist Church where she served faithfully for over 30yrs in the Anchor club and the Women’s Joy Ministry. In recent years

she joined Vision of Hope Baptist Church.

In 1963 Lenora stepped in to help her brother William Dudley Brittingham with caring for his six children. Her faith and belief in family was one of the most important things to her, and she would not allow her family to be separated. Alongside her brother she helped to raise his five girls and one boy as well as her own three children. When it came to Lenora nothing was more important than family.

Lenora had another name that many affectionately called her "Grammy". She was given this name by her great niece (granddaughter) and she carried it with her for over 50yrs through her "Grammy Daycare". In Grammy Daycare, she raised 4 generations that regarded her as more of a grandmother than an aunt. These generations included her nieces and nephews, great nieces and nephews, great great nieces, and nephews, and even neighbors.

Continuing her legacy are her three living children Cecil (Rylene), Charlene, and Lenora (Ray). 6 grandchildren Darryl, Andre, Jamilah, Maurice, Brittany, and Immanuel. 7 great grandchildren Darryl, Jabree, Keyante, Aminah, Jacques, Milan, and Jamison.
