Kevin loved spending time with his children, grandchildren, and great-grandson. Whether it was a family event or just hanging out at home, he was happy. He loved to pile the little ones into the back of his pick-up truck, bouncing them around Chester like he was out in the rural countryside. Kevin also enjoyed hanging out and riding around with his buddies.
