Maggie Lee Jacobs was born December 23, 1955, to Irma Jo McPhail Jacobs and the late James R. Jacobs. She was born at home on her grandparent's farm in Wade, N.C. Her granddad nicknamed her (Husky), and family and friends call her "M", Mag and Maggie.

Her parents moved the family from Wade, N.C. to Chester, PA where she attended Perry Wright Elementary School. She played field hockey and basketball at Chichester Senior High School until she graduated in 1973. After high school Maggie attended North Carolina Central University for two years and then earned her bachelor's degree in Accounting from Widener University in 1992. In the year of 2004, Maggie earned her MBA in Logistics from Wilmington University.

Maggie first met "Chard" (as she called him) Richard Johnson in ninth grade in 1969. Richard sat in "M's" chair on the first day of school... "M" came in late that day and when she arrived she asked, "who is that boy sitting in my seat?" then in 1971 they started dating while in high school. Dating for eleven (11) years, Maggie knew she had met the love of her life. They married on September 4, 1982 and shared forty (40) years in wedded bliss. After their marriage they became parents to her biological niece Enjoli Sincere Jacobs, whom they loved and raised as their own since she was seven (7) months old.
