Nancy Carol Majors-Young was a remarkable woman who lived a life filled with love, faith, and dedication. Born on December 20, 1947, to Elizabeth "Betty" Majors and George A. Majors, Sr., in Chester, Pennsylvania, she grew up alongside her siblings: brothers Charles Peterson, George Majors II (predeceased), Edward "Chickie" Majors, and later Johnny "Tink" Harris, and sister Elisa Spivey (nee Harris).

Nancy was a strong caring mother to her children: Gary A. Majors and Brian Majors (both predeceased), Carol E. Scott (nee Majors), Nancy D. Young (Muffin), and Nicole C. Young. Nancy married Dewayne Young on June 23, 1973, and together they raised their children until their marriage dissolved in 1993. Nancy later opened her heart and home as she adopted 2 additional children, King Young and Kori Young. Her family was her greatest treasure, and she was always there for them with unwavering support and love.

A woman of strength and determination, Nancy's educational journey led her through the schools of Chester, Pennsylvania, where she developed a solid foundation for her future. In 2003, she achieved a significant milestone by earning her Bachelor of Science Degree in Psychology from the historic HBCU Cheyney University. Graduating with honors, Cum Laude, with a remarkable GPA of 3.69, she specialized in Social and Behavioral Science. Her pursuit of knowledge and excellence was evident when she transferred

from DCCC with an impressive GPA of 3.63.

Nancy had a love for old school gospel and R&B music, and her house often echoed with her beautiful singing. Her melodious voice filled the air as she shared her passion for music with her family. A devoted Christian, she cherished the words of the Bible and found solace in its teachings. She instilled the values of faith and strength in her family, teaching them by example to face life's challenges with courage.

Her kindness knew no bounds, as she was a foster parent and had a special place in her heart for people with disabilities. She worked diligently, rising from the kitchen to become a QMRP (Qualified Mental Retardation Professional) at Elwyn Inc., where she made a meaningful impact in the lives of others.

In April of 2022, Nancy was diagnosed with stage 4 cancer. Her children cared for her with the help of the dedicated nurses and staff from Mainline Hospice. It should be noted that her daughter, Muffin, selflessly transitioned into Nancy's primary caregiver from the onset of her illness until she left this life as she worked closely with Nurse Mindi and Health Aide Katrina to allow Nancy to receive care in her home. Nancy's grandson, Darius, also took on the role of caregiver along with Muffin due to the special bond that he shared with his grandmother. He demonstrated a level of maturity and love far beyond his years. Nancy was fortunate to have him by her side, offering care, companionship, assistance, and a listening ear. Darius' dedication to his grandmother's well-being and happiness speaks volumes about his character.

Her body succumbed to cancer on July 19, 2023 where she was at home surrounded by her children and grandchildren.

Nancy was known for her independence and private nature, but her love for

her family shone brightly. Her beautiful smile and warm presence were a source of comfort and joy to all who knew her. She was a strong provider and a loving caregiver, leaving a lasting legacy of love and compassion.

Having dedicated her life to her family, faith, and helping others, Nancy retired from Elwyn Inc. with pride and satisfaction, knowing she had made a difference in the lives of many. Her memory will forever live on in the hearts of her siblings, children, 15 grandchildren, 13 great-grandchildren, a host of nieces, nephews, cousins, extended family, friends, and all those whose lives she touched with her love and kindness.
