



## Rahn D. Scott Sr.

January 19, 1954 - April 7, 2024

Rahn Devin Scott, Sr., beloved father, singer, comedian, and actor was born in Chester, Pennsylvania on January 19, 1954, to the late Helena Scott and Demon Scott. He leaves behind a cherished legacy.

Survived by his three beloved children: Eboni Jones of Greenville, South Carolina, Devin Scott of Orange County, California, and Rahn Scott, II of Orangeburg, South Carolina, Rahn shared 31 years of marriage with Annie Lee Ussery of Shelby, North Carolina, from which their two sons were born.

Rahn's life was a tapestry of experiences. He attended Chester High School before moving to California, where he studied at Beverly Hills High School under the care of his late Aunt Dorothy Fitzgerald, who worked for the Jewish family of the late Joe Durst. There, he formed lasting friendships, even crossing paths with the brother of Diana Ross

and the Jackson 5.

After high school, Rahn pursued higher education at Winston-Salem State University on a football scholarship. Renowned for his musical talent, he became the lead singer of the band "Love Street Gang" and later studied education at the University of Houston Texas.

A skilled athlete, he played semi-professional baseball and managed a Fat Burger Restaurant in California.

Later, Rahn moved to the Carolinas with his family, embracing a new chapter. He

graced the stage in plays like "A Raisin in the Sun," "Fences," and "Driving Miss Daisy."

Additionally, he appeared in commercials, served as an extra in the movie "Eddie"

starring Whoopi Goldberg, and had speaking roles in independent films. At Pauline

Glenn Springs Elementary School, Rahn found fulfillment as the head of Environmental

Services, endearing himself to all.

In his later years, Rahn returned to his hometown of Chester, PA, where he met his

lovely companion of 17 years, Janice Alexander. He was employed at the Philadelphia

Airport until his retirement. He was honored with the Hall of Fame award from Chester

High School and delivered heartfelt renditions of Martin Luther King's "I Have

a

Dream" speech throughout Chester.

Rahn is survived by his companion Janice Alexander, his daughter Eboni Jones, son Devin (Melanie) Scott, son Rahn Scott, II, two brothers, Doug Scott and James Thomas, two sisters, Bernadette Green and Mary Wyatt, one aunt, Mayme Kane, and five cherished grandchildren, one great-grandchild, special stepsons and stepdaughters, and a host of nieces, nephews and friends.

Preceded in death by his sister Ethel Johnson, brothers Lawrence Wyatt, Gary Wyatt, James Wyatt, and Michael Wyatt and niece Marna Scott.

Rahn Devin Scott, Sr. touched many lives with his talent, humor, and unwavering love. He will forever be remembered and dearly missed.
