Rose Patricia Robinson was born on December 31, 1944 to the late Abraham and Rosella Rochester. She was the 4th child of 10 children, and preceding her in death were Eva, Paul, Floyd, Lloyd, and Nona. Rose was born in Woodlyn, PA and raised in both Woodlyn and Chester, PA where the family finally settled.

Rose was educated in the Chester Upland School District, while helping her mother raise her sisters and brothers. During that time, Rose attended and graduated from soldering school and began working as a certified solderer (building radios was her expertise) at the Wetherill Plant in the City of Chester. She also held jobs at Manchester Nursing Home and Prospect Park Nursing Home as a Senior Certified Nursing Assistant.
